PACD Legal Program

- PACD offers an on-call legal program through The Law Office of Andrew H. Shaw, P.C.
- For a discounted rate, conservation districts can receive legal advice.
- Currently the attorney rate is \$125.00 per hour and a paralegal rate of \$50.00 per hour.
- Program includes a full range of services and general legal advice, including document review, real estate assessment and timely responses to questions.
- Normal response time is 24 hours.




PACD hosts a Photo Library. To use the Photo Library submit a "PACD Photo Library Usage Agreement" form. PACD will then provide a link to the library.

Leadership Development Program

Financial and other support for the Building for Tomorrow Leadership Development Program is provided through a grant from the Pennsylvania State Conservation Commission. Guidance for the Program is provided through the Pennsylvania Conservation Partnership's Leadership Development Committee.

Full-time Leadership Development Coordinator

Identifies topics and resources in addition to personal and professional development topics for directors, managers, and staff.

- Staff designs best management practices (BMP's) to address agricultural and water quality concerns
- Partnership between PACD, DEP, and NRCS ensures that program goals are met and solutions are properly implemented

You can charge staff time:

- Unspent funds go "back into the pot" for the next round

DCNR Multi-functional Buffer Grant

- Provides funding to conservation districts to implement multi-functional riparian buffers
- A multi-functional riparian buffer provides opportunities for harvesting products such as nuts, berries, woody florals, forbs, and potentially woody biomass
- Grants available to conservation districts on a first-come, first-served basis
- Over \$750,000 available
- Over \$40,000 already obligated on almost 10 acres of buffers
- DCNR Riparian Forest Buffer Advisory Committee





PACD/NRCS Umbrella Program

- Partnership between NRCS and PACD
- Conservation district employees work on conservation practices and programs for both their conservation district and NRCS



- 11 Conservation Districts
- 19 Conservation District Employees
- Reimbursement is on a quarterly basis
