

Conservation Orders

Best TIME TO ORDER

- Sooner the better
- June thru October
- Districts estimate anticipated sales putting a tentative hold on product based on past history.
- As sales season progresses numbers are scaled back or moved up depending on County sale activity.



Suggested Varieties for Your Region

Sales info

• <u>Variety mix</u>

- Depends on the County location.
- Some counties will order just apple.
- Others will order a mix of apple, peach, plum, pear and cherry
- All request semi dwarf freestanding tree on apple.

Cut off time for sales

- March 1st is preferred date
- Gives us adequate time to set the order back
- Also allow us to time to sell any excesses.

Advanced deposits

- Typically ask for a 25% deposit
- Conservation Districts deposits will be waived. Nice if the order has a PO #.
- Date of tree sale
- For Motor Freight shipping: generally like to ship by 1st three days of the week.

Pre tagging and Bundling of orders

- Every District somewhat different
- Can print extra tags
- ACN can tag every tree
- Some request bagging and tagging
- Special packaging- two or three apple varieties per bag, one peach per bag, two different plums per bag or two different pears per bag

Scab Immune Varieties

INITIALTM



- (X-6163 Cltv.)
- Scab-resistant
- Picks one week before Gala
- Prone to fruit drop
- Fruit has good size with a crisp, mild acidic flavor
- Pollen sterile

CRIMSONCRISP®



- PP#16,622 (CO-OP 39)
- Origin: Purdue-Rutgers Coop
- Tart, sweet flavor
- Flexible harvest date
- Tolerates heat; no sunburn observed to date
- Scab-resistant
- Late blooming
- Fire blight susceptible
- Huge potential for U-Pick, packer potential if enough volume planted.

LIBERTY



- Resistant to apple scab, cedar apple rust, fire blight and mildew
- Yellow fleshed desert apple
- Vigorous and an annual bearer
- Picks before Golden Delicious

ENTERPRISE[™]



- (Co-op 30)
- Deep red apple with medium to large size
- Highly resistant to fire blight and cedar apple rust
- Becoming an important processing variety

GOLDRUSH

- (CO-OP 38)
- One of my late season favorites
- A Jekyll and Hyde apple
- Tart off the tree, sweet as sugar when stored
- Renewed interest as a main player for hard cider
- Tree habit very friendly, precocious even on big roots
- Apple is susceptible to cracking
