


Resource and Communications Center

Hosts poster contest and annual awards program recognizing outstanding conservation district directors, employees, legislators, and other partners



The activities range from participating in large community events, to hosting professional workshops and technical training sessions, to going out in the field to provide one-on-one





Nonpoint Source Pollution Educational Mini-Grants

- For adult education only
- You can charge staff time (administrative assistant's time copying/printing materials, manager's time promoting the project). Staff time doesn't just mean the person holding the workshop.
- Evaluations are required
- You can count staff/presenters in food costs (keep to \$13/person/day for a full-day workshop)
- No match required
- You can apply for as many as you like
- Unspent funds go "back into the pot" for the next round
- New round opens in January each year

Riparian Buffer Sub-Grants



- Provides funding to conservation districts to implement <u>multifunctional AND conventional</u> riparian buffers
- Grants available to conservation districts on a firstcome, first-served basis
- About \$75,000 available

Partners Providing Match Resources

- Master Watershed Steward Program
- CBF Keystone 10 Million Trees Program



This program is financed by a grant from the Community Conservation Partnerships Program under the administration of the Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, Bureau of Recreation and Conservation.

Lawn Conversion Sub-Grants



- Funded through a \$100,000 Community Conservation Partnerships Program Grant from the PA Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR)
- Offers Lawn Conversion training and mini-grants to Pennsylvania's conservation districts
- Will help the Commonwealth achieve a goal of planting 5,000 acres of upland forest and 5,000 acres of meadow by 2025
- About \$75,000 available



The Lawn Conversion Program for Conservation Districts is financed in part by a grant from the Community Conservation Partnerships Program, Environmental Stewardship fund, under the administration of the Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, Bureau of Recreation and Conservation.

Ag Plan Reimbursement Program

- Statewide program
- Offered on a first come, first served basis
- Plans eligible for reimbursement include
 - Manure Management (Chapter 91)
 - Nutrient Management (Chapter 83)
 - Ag E&S (Ch. 102) NRCS Conservation Plan may meet this requirement
- Encourages landowners/operators to work with their local conservation districts to pursue funding for ag plan development
- 20% match is required from the landowner/operator (or the conservation district in some approved cases)
- The maximum reimbursement per plan is \$1,500 or 80% of the cost of the plan, whichever is lower. Ag landowner/operators may qualify for reimbursement for more than one ag plan up to a maximum amount of \$6,000

Engineering Assistance Program (TAG)

- Provides statewide engineering and soils technical assistance for developing or implementing a watershed assessment, watershed restoration plan or watershed protection plan
- PACD employs eight conservation engineers and technicians in four regional offices
- Staff designs best management practices (BMP's) to address agricultural and water quality concerns
- Partnership between PACD, DEP, and NRCS ensures that program goals are met and solutions are properly implemented
- Funded through the Pennsylvania Growing Greener Program and the USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service

BMPs designed and installed in the photo: Roofed manure storage and heavy use area planned, other BMPs include roof runoff control with underground outlets, stabilized access road/walkway, surface inlets and swales to divert runoff from the new building, critical area seeding.

Certified Conservation Planner Program

 PACD is hiring six conservation planners or nutrient management specialists, who will work toward conservation planning certification for a two-year period to assist in conservation efforts across the Commonwealth.



PACD program staff will improve water quality by helping landowners complete and update:

- Conservation plans
- volunteer Act 38 Nutrient Management Plans (excluding Concentrated Animal Operations and Concentrated Animal Feeding Operations)
- Manure Management Plans
- Agricultural Erosion & Sediment Control Plans
- Funding provided by USDA NRCS and the PA State Conservation
 Commission



Leadership Development Program

Full-time Leadership Development Manager

Identifies topics and resources and coordinates professional development programming for conservation district personnel.

Director Training and Manager Training subcommittees

Provide input on programming topics, delivery, and resources.



- Currently the attorney rate is \$125.00 per hour and a paralegal rate of \$50.00 per hour.
- Program includes a full range of services and general legal advice, including document review, real estate assessment and timely responses to questions.
